

In Recognition of GLSEN's Rise Up for LGBTQ+ Youth Campaign

WHEREAS, K-12 schools must be safe learning environments that include and affirm LGBTQ+ young people, especially those who are transgender, nonbinary, intersex, Black, Indigenous, people of color, people with disabilities, and from all communities that experience marginalization; and

WHEREAS, GLSEN and advocates nationwide have designated 2023-2024 as a time for communities to Rise Up in support of LGBTQ+ young people in schools; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ young people frequently experience bias-based bullying and harassment, discrimination, and punitive discipline that increases the likelihood they will enter the school-to-prison pipeline. LGBTQ+ young people are also more likely than their non-LGBTQ+ peers to experience mental health concerns, including stress, anxiety, and depression; and

WHEREAS, every young person in America must have equal educational opportunities and freedom from the fear that their basic civil and educational rights will be taken away from them; and

WHEREAS, young people who develop in positive school climates, free of bullying, harassment, and discrimination, report greater physical and psychological safety, greater mental well-being, and improved educational and life outcomes; and

WHEREAS, positive educational and scholastic transformations must recognize that all communities deserve to be acknowledged and affirmed in our schools; and

WHEREAS, we seek to encourage the best possible future for all young people, including those who identify as LGBTQ+, without exception; and

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, as City Commissioners of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 27, 2023, as:

GLSEN's Rise Up for LGBTQ+ Youth Day

in the City of Fort Lauderdale.
